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
INTRODUCTION

- 5. Specific shipping requirements for the order. If no shipping requirements are specified, the preferred vendor carrier and method will be selected.


BRUSH DECK ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM


SQUEEGEE ASSEMBLY - STANDARD 28" DIAGRAM


SQUEEGEE ASSEMBLY - OPTIONAL 31.5" DIAGRAM

SQUEEGEE SUPPORT ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM




CHASSIS ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM


STEERING COLUMN ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM


STEERING WHEEL ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM

FRONT WHEEL ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM





SOLUTION TANK ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM



RECOVERY TANK ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM



WATER DISTRIBUTION ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM




